

“When we managed to get out of Syria, where our lives were in danger, I only thought about how I was going to protect my children, to shelter and feed them, since we no longer had any money and all our savings had run out. But we couldn’t go back; we had to take the risk. We had to reach Europe. If we didn’t want to see our children drown in the sea, we would have to reach Melilla however possible.”

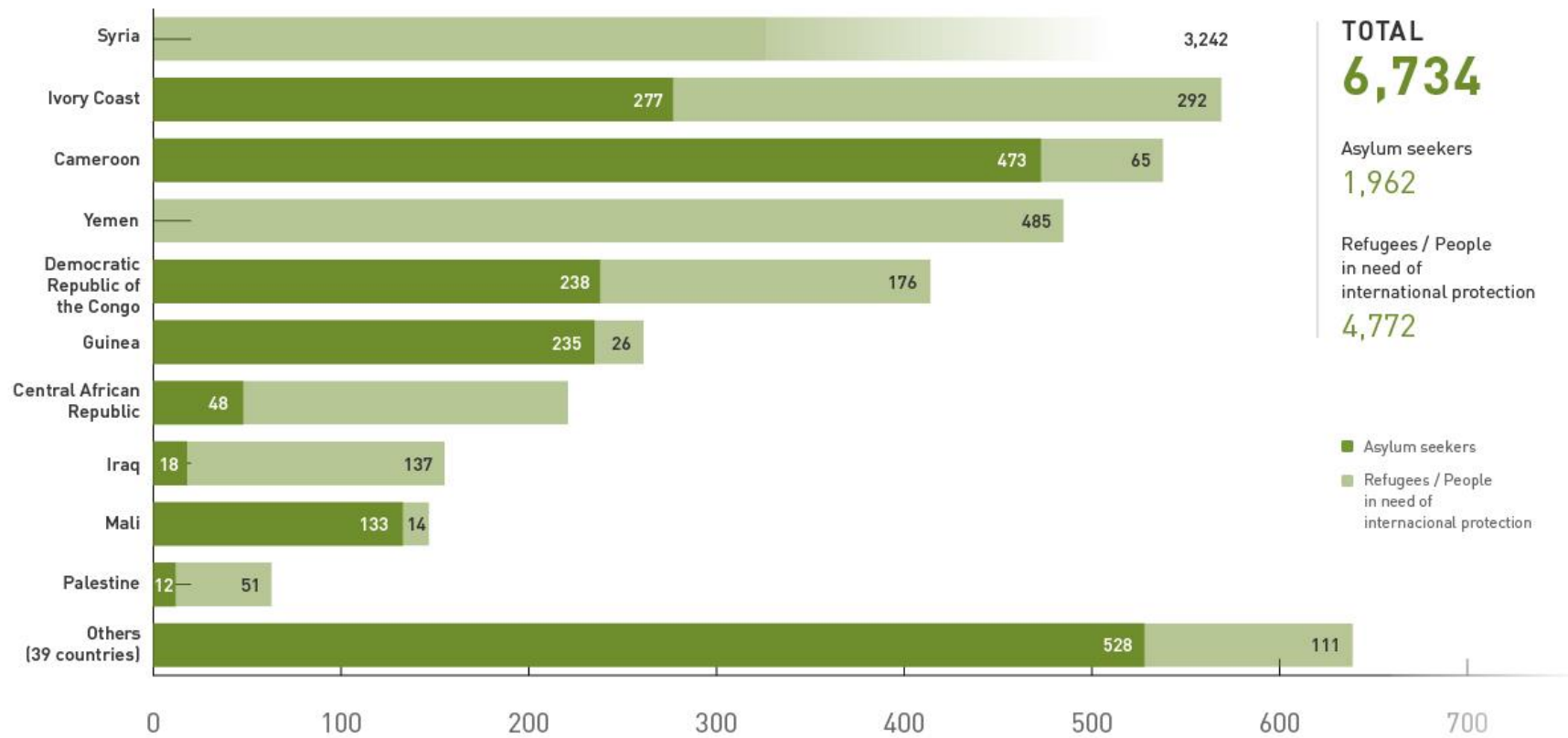

REFUGEES AND ASYLUM SEEKERS IN MOROCCO: NUMBER AND COUNTRY OF ORIGIN

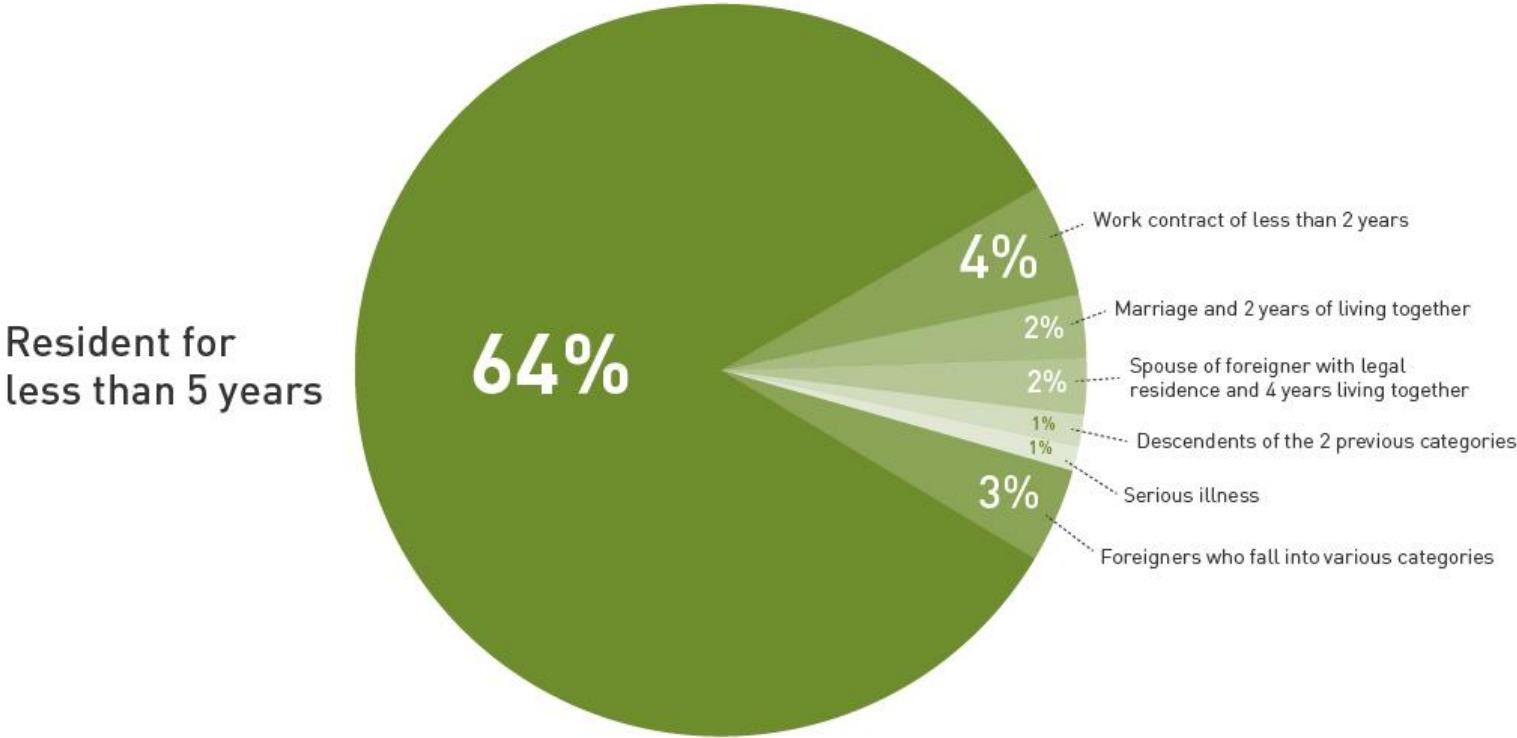
